






Workshop – Session 2 - OER, and Techno-Pedagogy

- Redistribute share copies of the original content, revisions or remixes with others.
- Retain keep access to the materials after the learning event.

Madam in a very interactive and elaborate way explained the participants about the different copyright licenses designed by the non-profit organization Creative Commons along with their characteristics. In addition to this Madam mentioned about the TIPS Framework of CEMCA that states about the certain criteria to be taken care of while creating OERs so as to ensure good quality under the Quality Assurance Guidelines for OERs. Furthermore Madam made us aware about the various advantages as well as the challenges of OER. Along with this a hands-on session was done by Madam to inform the participants about the various OER websites and OER repositories. This included OER Commons, YouTube Search, Google Images, Open Text Book Library, Oasis, COL's Open Access Repository, Pixabay etc. Madam ended the lecture with a very beautiful quote "If you have knowledge, let others light their candles in it" which went very well with the essence of the topic OER.














PARTICIPANTS' PROFILE AND FEEDBACK




