# Inclusive Life-long Learning

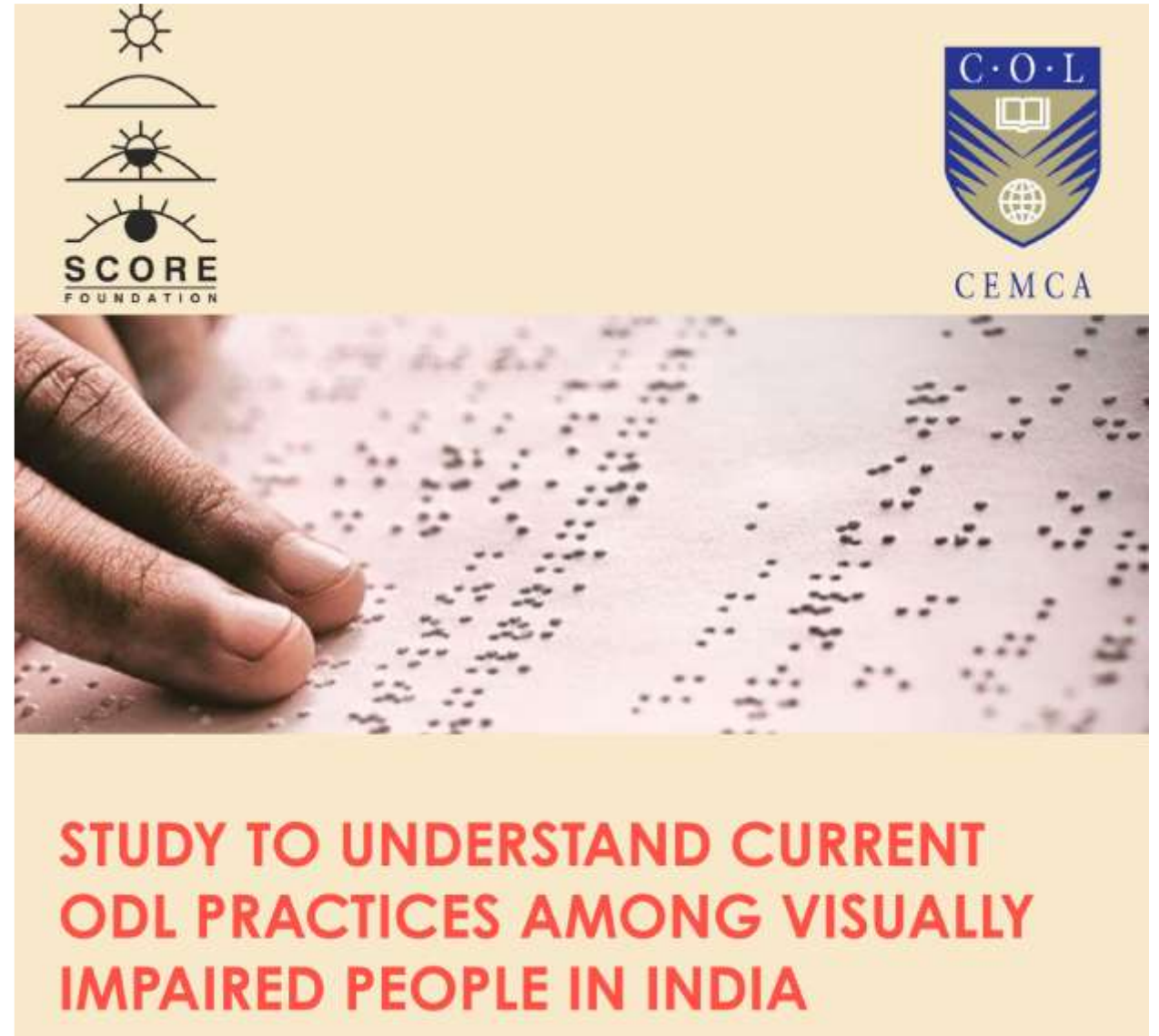
**embraces learner-centred approaches and ensure equal access to education and constant training for every individual regardless of his/her gender, age, socio-economic status and/or physical or mental condition**

# Digital Revolution influencing Inclusive Lifelong Learning

- ODL is one of the most inclusive methods of learning
- ODL is most often first choice (rather than second chance) learning for the marginalised
- Public institutions cater more than the private ones
- Challenges continue on various fronts, especially in support services and access to assistive devices and technology
- Policy intent requires translated in practice and programmatic activities
