COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Covid-19 pandemic has caused havoc in the education system. To reach the learners, Indian universities and colleges are encouraged to make use of SWAYAM Online platform. SWAYAM, which stands for Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young Aspiring Minds, is an Indian Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) platform.

SWAYAM is an initiative launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India under Digital India to give a coordinated stage and free entry to web courses, covering all the levels of education institutions. UGC, New Delhi, is encouraging faculty members to submit their expression of interest for developing UG and PG courses. The top 100 universities under the NIRF ranking are being encouraged to start online courses as part of the self-reliant India campaign. The Government is also liberalising distance and online education regulatory framework.

Faculty members of universities and colleges require training so that they can design and develop quality online programmes based on the SWAYAM Guidelines. Hence, it is necessary to develop an online course on SWAYAM which will motivate and guide faculty members through the step-by-step procedure for development of courses for SWAYAM. This MOOC will build the capacities of the faculty members to develop Online Programmes.

ORGANIZED BY

The Centre for Staff Training and Development (CSTD) of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Open University launched a MOOC on Online Course Development for SWAYAM in collaboration with Commonwealth Educational Centre for Asia (CEMCA). The Course was developed by Commonwealth Educational Centre for Asia (CEMCA) with highly experienced experts.

- Describe Online Education and SWAYAM at large.
- Prepare the proposal for Course development for SWAYAM as per the guidelines and seek funding for new and repurposing of course.
- Write content in text format using various resources and Open Educational Resources.

- Facilitate learners through discussion forum.
- Develop assignments and quizzes for learner's formative and summative assessment.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Teachers of KG to PG who want to learn more about online course development will find this MOOC informative and engaging. Using up-to date learning design and simple, accessible technology, the course runs on an easy-to-use learning platform available via the Internet. The course is designed to run over two weeks and requires approximately three to five hours of time each week. Designed to accommodate learners' busy schedules, the course offers flexibility with options for learning the content. The participants learn from readings, videos, discussions with other participants and instructors, meaningful exercises, and quizzes. Certification is available for those who wish to complete all required exercises and quizzes.




FIGURE 3: DR. ANIRBAN GHOSH ADDRESSING THE PARTICIPANTS




FIGURE 5: DR. JEETENDRA PANDE ADDRESSING THE PARTICIPANTS




FIGURE 6: DEMONSTRATION OF LMS BY DR. JEETENDRA PANDE

Prof. Chakrapani Ghanta, Director- Center for Staff Training and Development (CSTD) informed that CSTD was founded in 1992 and it has offered many training programs in the past. Realizing the importance of online teaching, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic, BRAOU is offering the FDP program through online mode. The session ended with the formal vote of thanks which was delivered by Dr. Shiffon Chatterjee, Sr. Program Officer-CEMCA.

DETAILS ABOUT THE COURSE

BRAOU offered the online FDP program from 20 December 2021 to 02 January 2022 through MOODLE platform. However, due to the repeated request of the participants, the program was further extended to 09 January 2022.

Course materials were designed and developed by Dr. Manas Ranjan Panigrahi, Sr. Program Officer, Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia, New Delhi and his team from IGNOU, UOU and NSOU.

The content including video lectures, power point presentation, transcripts, etc were uploaded and placed in the sequential manner and provided navigation for easy access. Details about the course are given below:

PARTICIPANT REGISTRATION AND PARTICIPATION

Initially, BRAOU announced the courses details in the University website and invited the participants for registration through Google form. A total of 1840 participants registered for the FDP program. After removing the duplicate and incomplete entries, the total number of participants was 1673. To facilitate the registration on the course portal, the organizers created the login for the participants and the credentials were sent to them along with instruction through registered email. Of these, 470 participants logged in to the course portal at least once.

GENDER

Out of 1673 participants, 1100 (65.75%) were male and 573 (34.25%) were female. This reveals that more male participants registered for the course as compared to female participants.

MONITORING THE PROGRESS OF PARTICIPANTS USING LOG REPORT OF MOODLE

Log Report of MOODLE shows activity within the course. It allows teachers to see what course material and activity are being used and when by the participants. For example, a teacher can check that an individual participant has viewed the course material for that week or topic they declare to have read, and how long. This helps the teacher to monitor the participants and motivate them to

take part in the course. The log reports of the FDP on Developing Online Course for SWAYAM offered by the UOU have been analysed and the data is given in the following sections.

Learning objectives viewed by the participants

Learning objectives are statements which describe the expected outcome of a curriculum, course, lesson or activity in terms of demonstrable skills or knowledge that will be acquired by the participants after completing the course. The figure shows the number of participants who accessed the learning objectives of the FDP programme which was listed under the FDP announcement. There is a total of 900 views by 206 users. It is important that participants view the learning objectives to know the outcomes of the course.



Course materials viewed by the participants

Course materials are the most essential component of online courses. Participants learn from this content to enrich themselves. The content should be interesting as the teacher is away from them. Since the course is accessed through different devices, the content should be enriched with multimedia component to retain the attention of the participants. This course has seventeen topics and has videos, pdf of transcript and ppt files for content. The participants have accessed the content to learn the course.

The third live session held on 05 January 2022 was attended by approximately 100 participants through ZOOM and the session was broadcast on YouTube.




Quizzes




Quiz 1 was released on 21 December 2021 which has total 3397 views by 256 users. Total number of attempts for Quiz 1 is 595.



Quiz 2 was released on 22 December 2021 which has total 1653 views by 193 users. Total number of attempts for Quiz 2 is 295.




Quiz 3 was released on 26 December 2021. This has a total of 1171 views by 172 users. Total number of attempts for Quiz 3 is 230.




Quiz 4 was released on 26 December 2021 which has total 1575 views by 171 users. Total number of attempts for Quiz 4 is 312.




Feedback






The course feedback survey had participation from various States and Union Teritories of India. The details of the representation from the States and Union Teritories are as follows:




The data revealed that most of the respondents 59 (37.58%) are in the age group 45 to 54 years, and 58(36.94%) are from the 35 to 44 age group. The 25 to 34 age group has 22(14.01%) respondents. While about one-tenth 18(11.46%) of the participants are from 55 to 64 age group. There is no participation from age groups above 65 years, 17 to 24 years and below 17 years.




The data revealed nearly half of the respondents 67 (42.68 %) were from Science/Technology discipline, while 31 (19.75 %) of them were from Humanities. There were only 13 (8.28 %) respondents from the Languages. The least number of respondents 13 (8.28 %) are from Commerce. There are 22 (14.01 %) respondents from Other disciplines.




Out of total 157 respondents, 11 (7.01 %) of the respondents came to know about this course through BRAOU website, 31 (19.75 %) through email notification, 40 (25.48 %) through Social-Media, 59 (37.58 %) through Friends or Colleagues and 16 (10.19 %) through Brochures.




The course was also available through MOODLE app, which can be downloaded from Google Play Store. Out of total 157 respondents, 119 (75.80 %) attended the FDP through website elearning2.uou.ac.in and 38 (24.20 %) attended through Mobile App.



It is interesting to know the reason for taking this FDP program by the participants. Out of total 157 respondents, 51 (32.48 %) participants attended this FDP to design a new course, 1 (0.64 %) attended this FDP as the course is free and open, 19 (12.10 %) attended out of curiosity and personal interest. The maximum number 81 (51.59 %) of respondents attended for professional development, while 3 (1.91 %) attended to get a certificate or credentials and remaining 2 (1.27 %) reported Other reasons.



The FDP program was not only attended by the Teachers 135 (85.99 %) but a good number of un-affiliated learners 8 (5.10 %) and education administrators 14 (8.92 %) also attended this FDP.



The respondents were asked questions pertaining to the attainment of the learning objectives of the FDP program and the items were measured on a 5-point scale where: 1-strongly disagree, 2-disagree, 3-neutral, 4-agree, and 5-strongly agree.



The average responses of the respondents fall between 4.54 to 4.22 which indicated positive agreement towards the items related to learning outcomes. Most of the respondents reported that the after the completion of the FDP program, they are able to describe the Online Education and SWAYAM at large (average: 4.54). They reported positively that they are able to develop assignments and quizzes for learner's formative and summative assessment (average: 4.42). The participants can facilitate the learners through Discussion Forum (average: 4.45). Additionally, the respondents reported that they are able to deliver contents in the form of video using PPT, animations, illustrations, etc. (average: 4.41). Notably, respondents admitted that they are able to write contents in text format using various resources and Open Educational Resources (OERs) (average: 4.41). Respondents reported that they can prepare the proposal for Course development for SWAYAM as per the guidelines and seek funding for new course and repurposing of course (average: 4.22). Similarly, they accepted that, if required, they can create a MOOC for SWAYAM in their discipline using 4 quadrant approach (average: 4.25).


After completing all the mandatory requirements for successfully completing the FDP program, 152 participants downloaded the certificate.
