It is said that AI will take away many jobs. But each new development creates new opportunities too. What new opportunities will come up for PwDs through AI?





First, some data points

- ❖ PwDs, 15% of world population or 1B people, are the world's largest minority.
- Disabilities mean multi-dimensional poverty; earn less, less likely employed.
- Most vulnerable members of society within rural-developing settings.
- *Although, by stat, it should be 200M, official stat suggests 21 million persons with disabilities in India, 70% of them being unemployed or underemployed.






AI and PwDs

- ❖ Make things accessible for PwDs: What the PwDs could not access earlier, AI can make it possible today — speech to text, text to speech, image recognition, assistive robots, real time translation, transliteration, transcription, etc., Cognitive assistance, AI-powered prosthetics and many more.
- ❖ Job creation and enhanced production: flexible and remote work but also occupations that require high level of concentration, workplace access. AI tools can assist PwD to do their jobs more efficiently.
- **❖ More than education, skills:** that can foster their participation. In AI/ML and Data Analytics, especially.
- ❖ Inclusive work environments: Assistive technologies play a vital role in making work environments more inclusive





AI and the job market

- ❖ A good indication that there is **increasing demand for AI exposure** in jobs advertised
- **❖ Wage premium** for certain jobs − database designers, administrators, lawyers, sales personnel, financial analysts, accountants, etc.
- **4.8 times higher productivity** in AI-exposed sectors
- Lower job growth in AI-exposed occupations
- ❖ Fastest growing skill categories − Performing arts, sports, recreation, personal care and services, energy and utilities, environmental protection, waste management, etc. (relatively harder for AI to perform
- ❖ Slowest growing skill categories − IT, design, sales and analysis
- ❖ OECD countries are more prone to losing jobs to AI; hence, reskilling is key








What are the issues?

- Accessibility issues
- Discrimination and bias
- Lack of training and education opportunities
- Mobility
- Limited awareness
- Inadequate support systems





What are the generic solutions?

- ❖ Accessible infra in every office, transaction and system, including flexible working culture and work environment
- Organise and provide access to assistive technologies
- Create inclusive policies, hiring practices, CPD, awareness and training in every function of government





What are the specific AI-related solutions?

- Ensure the responsible use of AI
- Encourage the use of AI to grow productivity and prosperity but ensure that prosperity from AI adoption is widely shared
- Support the use of AI to augment rather than replace workers; therefore, support workers with training/retraining, worker protections, and safety nets
- Shape the education system to help prepare workers for an AI age, initiate special incentives for PwDs
- ❖ AI officers in every department and joint-up approach within the government to look at the impact of AI on PwDs
