Ratifying the usage of online strategies and empowering teachers in higher education, to create a blend of an online and offline mode of course delivery, the UGC has acknowledged the need for and importance of using blended learning strategies in education. This project aims to empower teacher in higher Eduction from Bihar to implement Blended learning in their classrooms.

Objectives of the Project

- ♣ To improve the knowledge and skills of teachers/academics in higher education to develop and offer Online/Blended Course.
- ♣ To enable the staff/faculty members to the process of planning, designing, developing and delivering online courses.
- ♣ To adopt Learning Management Systems (LMS) like Google Classroom & Moodle Platforms as an adjunct to face-to-face teaching and to teach in a full online or distance learning context.
- ♣ To find out the prospects and challenges of providing online/blended learning in the context of Higher Education Institutions in Bihar.



Dr. Mukesh Kumar, Associate Professor, School of Education, MGCU, Motihari, Bihar welcomed the guests. He said that covid-19 has led to increase in online teaching and has led the teachers to use and learn about online learning platforms and technology. He gave a brief background information related to the online-teaching and learning. And he welcomed each and everyone in the program and gave their brief introduction.

Prof. Asheesh Srivastava, Head & Dean, School of Education, MGCU, Motihari, East Champaran, Bihar showed his gratitude for being able to conduct this program by extending thanks to Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, MGCU, Motihari, East Champaran, Bihar-Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Sharma, Prof. Madhu Parhar, Director, Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia, New Delhi, Prof. G. Many webinars, patents, etc has been conducted and contributed by the faculty of MGCU. In short, he told about the achievements of MGCU within a short span of 5 years of establishment of the university.

Workshop – Session 1 - ICT tools in Teaching Learning

In this session, practical learning was performed by expert on- 'ICT tools In Teaching Learning: Using Google Tools including use of YouTube Channel, Use of PPT, Creation of Audio and Video Contents, Creating Learner Centric Video Lectures'. This session was taught By Dr. Pranita Gopal Instructional Coach & Visiting Faculty School of Education, Ravenshaw University, Cuttack, Odisha.









Dr. Pathloth Omkar, Assistant Professor, School of Education, MGCU welcomed Dr. Pranita Gopal, Instructional Coach & Visiting Faculty, School of Education, Ravenshaw University, and introduced her to the guests and participants. She took her class on ICT tools in Teaching Learning: Using Google Tools including use of YouTube Channel, Use of PPT, Creation of Audio and Video Contents, Creating Learner Centric Video Lectures.

First she showed few numbers on screen and asked how many numbers the participants can see. The participants replied differently. Finally she explained that although in general the participants can see only 3 numbers, but through deep observation one can see 9 numbers in them, and like that if the students attain class and take that from multiple dimensions they can achieve the best learning. Then madam presented a puzzle image on screen and asked the participants to tell what they get from the image. The participants replied their understandings and finally madam explained that it was actually the image of Jorge Newton in illusion painting. She nicely explained that when we talk about ICT, it should be taken in holistic picture, by ICT neither should be influenced nor should be neglected.

She explained the significance of Oath as inculcating the ideas as responsibilities. For learning she asked to remember about own pace, learning goals and choosing the own learning path. She asked to keep in mind the copyright issues regarding using the ICTs. Then again she shared one image on screen and explained the meaning that happy teachers can make the students happy. She called the faculties to make the classes joyful, engaged and learner centric. She said that 'agency of choice' should be given to the learners. She explained it through example of the lesson of NEP 2020, and explained when different images will be appeared in the mind of learner about the issue; they should be given opportunity to express them.

She explained the 12 abilities for the today's students in 21st century for success in their career during information age. The learning Skills include creative thinking, creativity, collaboration and communication. The Literacy Skills include information, media and technology. The Life Skills include flexibility, leadership, initiative, productivity and social skills. About Assignments she talked to connect that with real world problem solving including the characteristics of adoptable change, transfer of knowledge, reflectivity, community outreach and impact, UN sustainable development goals, etc. She emphasized on peer evaluation strategy also. Then she explained on Google Docs on how can we use that collaboratively. She demonstrated that with the help of 'See version history' people can do that. Then she demonstrated how we can convert into pdf on Google Docs without any converter. Then she demonstrated the usage the add-ons on Goggle Docs. She also demonstrated how to use Google slides and can we add audio and videos on slides. He explained on hyperlink presentations also. Then she explained and demonstrated how to prepare

Google forms with different sections for multiple type of samples together. Then explained on google boards, google seats, I am board and notebook. She demonstrated Padlets in discussion mode. She explained on Flip grid tool to use for videos preparation. She explained on Edupuzzle to use question-answer session and to prepare active learning environment. She discussed on the role of presentation screen on learning outcomes. For effective slides she talked on clear and proper color combination, right front, etc. She explained that the background should be transparent, in slides all the texts should not be included, only few ideas will come from a single slide, animations and notes can be used easily, videos can be embedded. There can be video into video. The Open Short software can be used to create and beautify videos. Madam demonstrated how to create u-tube channels private and public. She explained how we can use them in Google Classroom. She suggested the participants to create short but quality videos on their lessons in local language and then open them to OER so that besides his/her own students other students can be benefited to clarify their lessons.

Finally she opined that the role of teacher cannot be replaced through ICT, they can be support only. One question from the participants that can the children be taught in blended mode and madam replied that yes, that can be done something, like children watch television and learns, in this way. At the end Dr. Mukesh Kumar, Associate Professor, School of Education, MGCU offered gratitude to Dr. Pranita Gopal in behalf of the Department for the information rich class. Then Dr. Pathloth Omkar, Assistant Professor, School of Education, MGCU also offered his gratitude to Dr. Pranita Gopal for her nice class and to the guests, to the participants for their active taking part in the programme.

Workshop – Session 2 - Introduction to LMS: Google Classroom/Moodle

On October 9, 2021 the session beings with welcome address by Prof. Asheesh Srivastava, Head & Dean, School of Education, MGCU welcomed the chief guest and expert instructor of the session, Dr. Vaibhav Jadhav, Assistant Professor, Department of Education & Extension, School of Education, Savitribai Phule Pune University. Then Dr. Manisha Rani, Assistant professor, School of Education, MGCU welcomed him once again as the programme coordinator of the session. Ms. Suprabha Dey, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCUB introduced him to the participants of the programme.









Dr. Vaibhav Jadhav started his class on MOOCs in relation to Blended Learning. He talked on different State initiative programmes on education system such as Sarva Siksha Abhiyana (SSA) (2000-2001), Rastriya Madhyamik Siksha Abhiyana (RMSA)

(2009), Rastriya Uchhatara Siksha Abhiyana (RUSA) (2013), etc. He said that as Abhiyan, SSA was launched first, then gradually RMSA and RUSA have been launched, and a lot of allocation of finance has been invested for them. National Mission on Education through ICT (NMEICT) (2009) has been launched also, but the earlier before COVID-19 Pandemic people were not such aware and careful on ICT, a number of hurdles were and are to implement the beautiful initiatives. Now, during COVID-19 Pandemic, people has become very close to ICT techniques, as well as government is investing funds for them, and that's why this is the golden opportunity to spread the ICT initiatives and blended mode initiatives in country.

Then respected sir demonstrated GCED online campus and called all the faculties and research scholars to join in MOOC Course/s either Open Courses or Registration Courses on the platform which can be helpful for them to enrich themselves. Then he talked on SWAYAM as the largest MOOC online platform in India and world where 40 million people have been enrolled. Then he demonstrated 'Teacher and Teaching in Higher Education', one MOOC refresher course on SWAYAM developed by Savitribai Phule Pune University Pune [By Prof.(Dr) Sanjeev A. Sonawane & Dr. Vaibhav Jadhav].

He explained how to construct a MOOC courses including the title, time, writing about the course, aims and objectives, learning outcomes, course layout, content, introduction, coordinator, instructor, module, mentor, assessment process and references. He said that we should be very careful to determine the assessment process either it should be MCQ or open ended question-answer. When we will want to transfer course into blended mode for 700-1000 students we need to redesign the course. Like it is difficult to develop student's engagement in the programme, and that's why if there is 10 teachers of the subject, the student teacher system developed into 10:10 during the teaching-learning process. And which topics should be taught in face to face and which topics on online that should be determined through discussion among the teachers. The blended procedure is not easy, but very difficult. Lessons should be shared in such a way that students should have more role. Time management is very important factor to construct such course. There should be flexibility. The mentor would to attract the interest of the students. The students should have autonomy. As experimental course can be launched. As example if the student stays in Jammu & Kashmir, s/he can study from there, contents/notes can be provided to him/her, for hands on experience s/he can come to campus, and discussion forum can be conducted on online/face to face.

The question was raised that now as COVID-19 Pandemic is going on that's why the blende mode can be applicable, but after the Pandemic when the condition will be normal and comfortable for face to face mode, that time will the programme/provision be necessary. Sir answered that yes in normal situation also the blended mode will work, because someone may stay in one tribal/backward area, and s/he may be unable to stay and study directly in campus, and then s/he can study in blended mode. We should take the mode in holistic way. At the end Mr. Prasenjit Roy, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCUB offered vote of thanks to the organizers, to the instructor of the session, and to all the participants.


Workshop – Session 3 - Design & Development of Lessons for Blended Learning


On October 10, 2021 the session beings with welcome address by Prof. Asheesh Srivastava, Head & Dean, School of Education, MGCU welcomed the chief guest and expert instructor of the session, Dr. Jayashree Shinde, Head, Department of Educational Technology, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai, Maharashtra. Then Dr. Manisha Rani, Assistant professor, School of Education, MGCU welcomed her once again as the programme coordinator of the session. Mr. Sourav Mahato, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCUB introduced her to the participants of the programme wonderfully. He introduced that Dr. Jayashree Shinde is currently heading the Department of Educational Technology, SNDT Women's University. She had headed the department for 11 years in the past. She is also the Director of Teaching Learning Centre established under Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission for Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) of Ministry of Education, India. Dr. Shinde was Standing Committee member of e-PG Pathshala, UGC and National Mission for ICT in Education (NMEICT) of the Government of India. She is currently on the Advisory

Committee of NCERT MOOC and Institutional Advisory Board (IAB) of Central Institute of Educational Technology (CIET-NCERT). Her expertise lies in ICT-based training, interactive material development, planning online courses, using constructivist instructional strategies, innovative assessments, etc. At the SNDTWU since 2011, and through the Teaching Learning Centre since 2018, she has organized several faculty training programmes on ICTs in Higher Education, Flipped Learning, MOOCs, Moodle LMS and OER Development, etc. And in today's session she will take deal discussion on Design and Development of Lesson for Blended Learning.









She offered her gratitude to the organizers. She introduced the class explaining the term Blended. She started to share the screen and played her own video on Blended Learning, and in between she was explaining pausing the video. She demonstrated different coloured images and asked the participants which image was looking good, beautiful and attractive. First she had given options A or B. Most of the participants identified B. Second time she again gave the options A or B, and again most of the participants replied B. Third time she again gave options A or B, and somebody said A, somebody B. She explained that Blended means Collaborations, the image which is more collaborative is more looking beautiful, and the meaningful blended is more beautiful. Then she started to explain what can be one beautiful class. She explored that one beautiful class will include group formations, interaction with learners, peer interactions, look & feel, learning experiences, learning material and classroom organizations. And in blended which classes will be conducted face to face and which on online they depend on different factors and should be decided by the faculties. It is not always right that if we use technology the class will be effective. It should be more interaction, more interesting and more meaningful beyond traditional lecturing. We should integrate technology and pedagogy. It will include inside classroom as well as outside classroom, with or without internet connectivity. It will include more interaction, eye contact, discussion as possible, use of smartphones, audios, pdf, e-books, e-journals, web pages, newspapers, speaky notes, virtual world, brain storming, question-reply, etc. when need/possible. It may include online collaboration, group projects, visits, etc. It is use of variety of meaningful tools and techniques instead of one. In offline classes lecture can be minimized and peer group interaction can be utilized. The classes can be shared on online, and from home one can access them. Virtual lab can be utilized. Scaffolding and support system should be used to handle the mode. Formative and summative evaluation should be used also for assessment. The ultimate skill is creation, and that can be created through optimum utilization of blended learning. Concept map can be utilized.

She explained that blended learning is a teaching-learning approach to be used by the teachers. Blended learning is an approach in which a teacher thoughtfully plans how s/he can use variety of tools, techniques and resources face to face and online for optimum level of understanding of the students. Then madam had done group activities with the participants through the sharing of jam board. She asked the


participants to identify different resources can be used for teaching-learning and to post them on jam board. And the participants were sending the different names of resources, and madam was differentiating among resources and non-resources on board. In that way madam identified OER, wikipage, you-tube, SWAYAM notes, web articles, e-books, journals, virtual lab, LMS, local depositories, NPTEL videos, etc. as resources. She eliminated few items which were not the resources.

Then she shared one another tab for participation of the workshop participants on jam board to post what can be the activities in classes. The participants identified different activities such as collaborative learning, storytelling, learning through games, discourse, field work, improvisation, lab work, role play, workshop, demonstration, brainstorming, quiz, précis writing, presentations, focus group discussion, seminar, essay writing, field visits, project, virtual excursions, experimentations, exhibitions, use of models, practical, concept mapping, mind mapping, etc. She separated few items from the activities such as TED, articles, CLS, community persons, community places, case study, infographic, maker spaces, etc. Madam discussed about few Learning Management System such as goggle classroom, Moodle, etc.

Then she discussed how the role of teachers in blended learning is. She said that teacher is facilitator here who can support and can provide scaffolding. She talked on resolving queries, analysis of content and guidance for new pedagogy. She asked participants to tale few types of different formative assessments, and the participants replied puzzles, teacher made test, assignments, project work, relevant gams, demonstration by students, probing questions, debate, group project, audio podcasts, elocutions, question-answer, etc. Then madam discussed on planning design for blended teaching-learning in one classroom including different factors and resources such as time, topic, content, outcomes, students, weightage, etc.

Finally there was question-answer session. One participant asked that what was andragogy, and madam answered that it actually the science to teach the adult students. One asked that which type of content can be delivered on online and which in offline. Madam answered that there is no certain rule on them that depends on the teacher, contents, students, etc. one asked why the name of the jam board becomes 'jam'. Madam replied that the creator has given the name. At the end of the programme Nabani Barman, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCU

offered vote of thanks to the organizers, to the instructor of the session, and to all the participants.




Workshop – Session 4 - OER, and Techno-Pedagogy

Respected professor discussed on OER and Techno-Pedagogy including Understanding of OER: searching, using, creating; Open Licenses-Creative Commons; Understanding of Techno Pedagogy.










He started his presentation cum discussion session. He said that now the distance between Bihar and New York is zero kilometers only due to technology. Now there are two types of university – Break University and Click University. The Break University means the university having traditional campus, and the Click University means the university which offers different courses and programmes on online. He discussed that which one is good, neither the Break University nor the Click University alone, we need to integrate them. Although we can be afraid of that technology can replace the teachers, but technology can't replace all the teachers. But the teacher who is not using technology can be replaced by the teacher who is using technology. He mentioned the words of John Dewey, "If we teach today's students as we taught yesterday's, we rob them of tomorrow". He discussed on COIL (Collaborative Online Innovative Learning). He discussed on the key elements of a pedagogical design including learning needs, public target, learning objectives, content and the process on how to measure the outcome. He discussed on T-Pack including Content, Pedagogy and Technology. On discussing Technological Pedagogical Knowledge (TPK) he discussed on the need and necessity of constructivist approach and design thinking. He mentioned that one picture equal to one thousand words. He also mentioned that according to psychology we learn 83% through visual, and 17% through others.

He talked on different open things including open access, open content, open course ware, open software, open education/e-learning and open educational resources. He said that now the students are very lucky for the open sources, and when he was student that time they were not available. He talked on Open Educational Resources (OER) which are available in public domain and which has intellectual property license that allows for free use, adaption and distribution. He talked on heutagogy, peera-gogy and cyber-gogy. He emphasized on co-learning and co-creating. He further explained that if one resource/e-resource has been created by someone in world, there is no need to creating again that wasting time and resource, better one new thing can be created using the time and resources.

He explained that blend means also bland of traditional and modern theories, knowledge and skills. In 21st century metacognition includes the bland of knowledge, skills and character. He emphasized on development and adaption of OER in a variety of languages and cultural contexts. He talked on different OER initiatives in India such as NDL (IIT Kharagpur – Free Access to Digital Content), NKN, Shodhganga, Shodhgangotri, EPrints@IISC, CEC, Project Ekalavya@IITB for Content Development, NPTEL, NROER, Project Oscar – IIT-B, Open Educational Resources for Schools – Homi Bhabha Center, NIOS-OER, TESS-India, KROER, etc. He discussed on the copyright of OER including Creative Commons Website, Creative Commons Licenses: commercial and non-commercial, OER/not OER, use/create, etc. He discussed on searching process of OER and MetaFinders. He discussed on MetaFinders including Marson's, Merlot's, OASIS and ORL. He talked on Open Access Library and Open Textbooks. He discussed on OER for Learning Outcomes, Open Course Ware (OCW), Open Course Library, WikiEducators, B Campus OpenEd, CCCOnline, Gratisography, Everystockphoto, OER Videos, Short Online Courses, Commonwealth of Learning, mind mapping, concept mapping, etc.

He discussed on the evaluation of OER including its accuracy, relevance, production, accessibility, interactivity, licencing and production quality. He talked on rubrics to evaluate the OERs.

Finally he welcomed for questioning from the participants. Ritu Sharma asked what design thinking is, and sir answered that it is project on how one student can understand. One participant asked what critical thinking is, and sir replied that it is the way to be productive. As example if one is asked is tomato fruit or vegetable, on which basis/ideas s/he can categorize tomato into vegetable that is critical thinking. One participant asked why does human being learns 83% through visual, and sir replied that that is the natural characteristics of brain cortex. Sir further discussed that what we listen that is automatically transferred in our mind through our mother tongue, and teacher is a pedagogy. At the end of the programme Suprabha Dey, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCU offered vote of thanks to respected professor, to the guests, to the organizers, and to all the participants.



Workshop – Session 5 - Interactive Presentation Tools & e-Assessment Tools

On October 12, 2021 the session beings with welcome address by Prof. Asheesh Srivastava, Head & Dean, School of Education, MGCU welcomed the chief guest and expert instructor of the session, Dr. Thiyagu K., Department of Education, Assistant Professor, Central University of Kerala, Kasargod, Kerala. Then Dr. Manisha Rani, Assistant professor, School of Education, MGCU welcomed him once again as the programme coordinator of the session. Ms. Indu Bala, Doctoral Research Scholar, School of Education, MGCU introduced him to the participants of the programme wonderfully. Respected sir discussed on Interactive Presentation Tools & E-Assessment Tools.









He started his session, and first explained very primary skills of online learning such as mute to unmute, use of chart box, how to use mouse for virtual blackboard during power point presentation. He explained 3Es formula including Engage, Encourage and E-Tools. He said that reinforcement is very important for good presentation on online to motivate the students to be engaged in process. For the purpose he suggested the faculties to call the students by name so that they can be alert as well be motivated.

He said that now the 21st teachers need 3Qs including DQ (Digital Quotient), IQ (Intelligence Quotient) and EQ (Emotional Quotient). The teachers must know about the latest tool, s/he must be updated. He said that in traditional system there was interaction among Teacher, Student and Content. And now there should be interaction with technology also with the other components. He explained on interactions including 'Student + Content = Relevance', 'Teacher + Content = Expertise', and 'Teacher + Student = Relationships'. Then he explained on 'Teacher + Student + Content = Meaningful Interaction'.

Then respected sir discussed on the use of Change Pointer to Laser Pointer, Laser Pointer to Change Pointer, Change Pointer to Arrow, Change Pointer to Pen, Change Pointer to Highlighter, Change Pointer to Eraser, View Task Bar, Black Board, White Board, Come back to normal presentation, Zoom In, Google Slide Add-Ons, Peer Deck for Google Slide Add-Ons, etc. Then he discussed on student paced activity vs instructor paced activity. He talked on synchronous mode and hjd wdl. Then he demonstrated the mobile view in screen. He talked and demonstrated on sound slides, google forms, g-mail communication, use of chat in normal classroom, etc. He talked on jam board, google classroom, google lens, google scholar, you tube, videos, Adams slides, Infographics, padlet, Gimkit, HOP, different innovative tools, etc. He talked on LearningApps.org, Interactive Whiteboard including Nearpod, Wakelet, etc., concept mapping, classroomscreen.com, LMS tools, painting, etc. He also discussed on online examination and Creative Common License.


VALEDICTORY SESSION


